Aims

At the end of this course, the student will have acquired knowledge and insight in the historical cultural, social, and business backgrounds of Great Britain, past and present, laying a sound foundation for dealing with professional situations in Great Britain. The student will be able to discuss, write, and present about/on topics to do with the historical cultural, social, and business aspects of Britain, on B2/C1 level of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.

Entry level: At least B2 level of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.

Teaching methods: Lecture and presentations.

Learning objectives: At the end of this course, the student will have acquired knowledge and insight in the historical cultural, social, and business backgrounds of Great Britain, past and present, laying a sound foundation for dealing with professional situations in Great Britain. The student will be able to discuss, write, and present about/on topics to do with the historical cultural, social, and business aspects of Britain, past and present, on B2/C1 level of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.

Content: Country and people, history, identity and attitudes, political life, the government, the law, international relations, the economy and everyday life.

The student will take part in discussions actively, will do a group presentation, and write an essay.

Assessment:

- a presentation introducing the week's topic, in groups. (30 %)
- an essay, individual (60%) (to be handed in in week 8)
- participation in discussions (10%)
